A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



Volunteer leadership is a key component of any nonprofit organization's success, and your Foundation is no exception. Due to several factors that include our volunteer leadership, we grew in net assets from \$400,000 in 1984 to \$27,224,900 in 2024. Also, with the help and guidance of our volunteers, in 2024 we distributed a total of over one million dollars in grants to (mostly) local charitable causes and to scholarships for students from Crawford County. And one other success worth noting: according to the most recent Lumina Foundation report, the post-high school educational attainment level of workingage Crawford Countians (25-64) grew from 26.7% in 2022 to 28.6% in 2023. This was an increase of 1.9% and beat our neighboring counties (Richland 0.2% and Ashland 0.3%). This also boosted our educational attainment rank among the 88 counties from 73rd place to 66th.

For various reasons, Crawford County has seen several staff members vacate their nonprofit organization leadership roles in recent months. When that happens, healthy volunteer leadership becomes even more critical. One definition of volunteering is "to do something, especially for other people or for an organization, willingly and without being forced or paid to do it." Leadership, on the other hand, can be defined as "the ability to guide and influence a group of people toward achieving a common goal." While effective leaders often display certain character strengths such as being influential, inspirational, and collaborative, leadership can be, and often is, demonstrated by people who don't necessarily carry formal leadership titles. Just as there are many ways to help by volunteering, there are also several types of leaders. My personal favorite is servant leadership, where the leader's goal is to serve people and share power with them. Several top-ranking companies in the U.S. have adapted servant leadership, citing that the employees' increasing personal commitment and engagement in turn helps the organizations grow. There have even been books written on servant leadership, such as Laurie Beth Jones' Jesus CEO: Using Ancient Wisdom for Visionary Leadership, where she translates biblical lessons of Jesus building a thriving enterprise from 12 disorganized disciples that can be applied to any business.

Our own volunteer leadership, also known as our Board members, recently conducted strategic planning to guide the Foundation's direction for the next five years. Given the increase in the number and intensity of natural disasters in recent years, one of the goals from the strategic plan was the development of a disaster plan. The hope is that in the event of a natural disaster so brutal that it overwhelms our first responders, the Foundation could be there as a safety net for emergency dollars in the immediate aftermath, as well as for dollars awarded through grants for rebuilding and recovery for some time after the event. Also emerging from the strategic plan was the need to begin empowering our youth by starting a youth philanthropy initiative. The idea will be to implement a grant program where the applicants are all asking for grants that benefit our local youth, and in turn local youth will be making the funding decisions on how to best help their peers. All of this will keep increasing the number of Foundation volunteers, which in 2024 totaled approximately 87 individuals without whom we could not thrive. (Nationally roughly one-third of the proprofit workforce is volunteers.) And the dollars to help implement these two initiatives of the proprofit workforce is volunteers.

(Nationally, roughly one-third of the nonprofit workforce is volunteers.) And the dollars to help implement these two initiatives came from a bequest whose owner was kind enough to leave us the money without any restrictions.

According to one Independent Sector national study, 57% of Americans have high trust in nonprofit organizations "to do what is right." That is more than any other sector: military (45%), small businesses (42%), media (20%), and local (25%), state (22%) and federal (18%) government. And according to Akilah Watkins, President and CEO, Independent Sector, "Nonprofits can earn public trust through volunteerism... When people serve, they often discover something essential: a shared humanity that crosses political, economic, and cultural lines... At a time when division dominates headlines, service to and with communities reminds us that we are more than what divides us... We have a responsibility-and an opportunity-to preserve and strengthen that trust in nonprofits... we can reinforce the most American of ideals: that everyone has something to contribute, and every contribution matters. Because trust is something we build together."

In closing, I am grateful for our volunteer leadership. I hope that they have experienced what numerous studies point to as the health benefits of volunteering – from lower blood pressure to reduced anxiety and depression. And while they do not receive pay for their good work, I hope that they have received the lift in spirits that comes from an "emotional salary."
