# A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT



In 2012, when The Wall Street Journal published "Why Can't We Sell Charity Like We Sell Perfume?" by activist and humanitarian Dan Pallotta, the nonprofit world took notice. Dan argued that if we let philanthropies operate like businesses – paying for talent, aggressively advertising, and taking fundraising risks – then capitalism could cause non-profits to be more affective and accomplish more good in the world.

Phil Buchanan displayed quite a different viewpoint in his book, Giving Done Right. Phil counters that counseling nonprofits to operate like a business is confusing and runs counter to achieving impact. He argues that giving effectively necessitates a different level of collaboration and relationship-

building, deep humility, and a recognition of how difficult it is to do good well – harder than building wealth.

Whichever opinion you may or may not buy into, the three organizations that oversee the nonprofit world – BBB Wise Giving Alliance, GuideStar, and Charity Navigator – released an open letter in 2013 regarding the overhead myth. They wrote that decisions about which charities to support should NOT be based on the percent of expenses that go to administrative and fundraising costs (overhead), but on their transparency, governance, leadership and results. They agreed with the Stanford Social Innovation Review that focusing on overhead creates "The Nonprofit Starvation Cycle," starving charities of the freedom they need to produce high performance. And they cited extensive research to back up their statements. Further, their second open letter in 2014 was directed towards charities themselves – encouraging them to help end the overhead myth by demonstrating ethical practice and sharing data, managing towards results, and helping educate funders/donors on the real cost of results.

If I may be so bold, I would add that there's one more way that would help make a difference: that nonprofits start asking for, and donors start giving to, charities' UNRESTRICTED budget. From unrestricted monies comes funding for expenses that allow charities to sustain and improve themselves – expenses like training, planning, evaluation, internal systems, fundraising expenses, and yes, even that not so exciting, but ever so necessary, electric bill. YOUR community foundation, for example, used an unrestricted bequest gift in 2018 (from the estate of local resident Dorothy Leuthold) to help NCSC's Crawford Success Center start an LPN program. This donation, as all of our competitive grants, came from the Foundation's unrestricted fund. And surely having the Crawford Success Center in our community – and their LPN program – is one of the reasons Crawford County had a 2% increase (10.5% - 12.2%) in our education attainment level from 2015-2018.

In closing, the nonprofit world and making donations in general can be complicated. The nonprofit industry is one leg of a three-legged stool that supports American society as we know it – along with the public and private sectors. We charities are the eyes, ears and conscience of society. So the next time you hear philanthropy being criticized, remind the critic that giving has done much towards what makes our country great, as well as contributed to improve the human condition worldwide. 



Notable Crawford Countian - Lauretta Schimmoler came to own a poultry business after working at a chicken hatchery in New Washington. After becoming a licensed pilot in 1929, she became the first woman in the U.S. to establish and operate an airport (Bucyrus). A colleague of Emilia Earhart, in 1944 Lauretta was commissioned to operate the Aerial Nurse Corps, training registered nurses to parachute into battlefields to administer life-saving aid to injured soldiers. Her feat is captured in the patriotic film, *Parachute Nurse*. Later, she became the first woman to command an American Legion post.

The Ohio Spiderwort plant, also commonly known as bluejackets, usually opens up its flowers in the morning and closes them by afternoon in sunny weather – but remains open on cloudy days.




